





- I. Call to Order: Meeting called to order by Randall Smith at 7:04 p.m. Present: Becky Clark, Tyler Smith, Mike Aquino, Sally Roe, Elise Constantini, and Ron Blumer. Administration: Al Brokopp. Audience: Mark Sonday.
- II. The District held an Informational Presentation Regarding the Initial Resolution Authorizing General Obligation Bonds
- III. Motion by Ron Blumer to have Morton as the bus garage contractor, seconded by Tyler Smith, motion carried. Motion by Becky Clark to buy a new John Deere mower and utility tractor and to trade in the current tractor, seconded by Elise Constantini, motion carried. A discussion was had about replacing a school bus and a school vehicle.
- IV. Motion by Becky Clark to adjourn the meeting at 8:23 p.m., seconded by Mike Aquino, motion carried.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF MONTICELLO Minutes of the Regular School Board Meeting October 12, 2022

- I. Call to Order: Meeting called to order by Randall Smith at 7:30 p.m. Present: Tyler Smith, Mike Aquino, Sally Roe, Becky Clark, Ron Blumer, and Elise Constantini. Administration: Al Brokopp, Mark Gustafson, Carley Francois and Denise Swanson. Faculty: Alma Mentz and Ryan Indergand. Audience: None.
- II. Pledge of Allegiance: The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.
- III. Approve Agenda: Motion by Ron Blumer to approve the agenda, seconded by Becky Clark, motion carried.
- IV. Communications/Concerns from the Public: Thank you to the Lions and the Lioness Club for the \$400 donation to "Stuff the Bus" for school supplies.
- V. Faculty Report: Ms. Mentz reported the whole elementary celebrated the student of the month per grade based on academics. These students were chosen by their teacher and received a medal and a certificate from Mr. Gustafson. PBIS students were also chosen for Growth Mindset (September's PBIS theme) per grade level and received a prize or reward of their choice. Middle School did an Escape Room for their PBIS reward and many groups were successful in putting October's theme, teamwork, to good use. Busy time in 4K... painting with Miss Paula; apple picking/apple sauce making (the kids did not like warm applesauce, but loved sugared apple sauce)/apple crisp; fire truck ride and learning about fire safety; going for a walk, scaring Mr. Brokopp and throwing leaves. Overall, 4K is going really well. A survey went out to parents showing that parents love all day 4K, majority of the kids are enjoying hot lunch and parents are enjoying the guidance program. Mr. Indergand reported that it's nice to see school closer to back to normal, making it easier on everybody. He also stated it's a busy start to the year, but all is well. Ms. Mentz mentioned the aides are doing a great job as well as the new teachers (please give them a shout out if you see them). Treasurer's Report: Tyler Smith reported total expenses of \$512,080.90 and total cash receipts of \$568,529.09. Food Service Report: None.
- VI. Administrative Team Reports: Mrs. Francois reported there was a self assessment and audit of 13 IEPs. She also reported special education staff have been busy with evaluations. She stated Janet Root, occupational therapist, and Cassie Wittman, physical therapist, are here 2 days each week. Mr. Gustafson reported there were students of the month for September, picked academically based on each teacher's criteria.

- VI. (cont'd) The kids were excited to receive a medal and a certificate. The PBIS team that has been created meets once a month to talk about behaviors they may see. They are trying to be proactive which, in turn, has created fewer behavior issues so far compared to last yr. Behavior issues are being handled a lot better this year which he credited the PBIS team for. Next Wednesday elementary is taking the kids to the New Glarus Woods as their PBIS teamwork project for this month. He mentioned the middle school girls' basketball team has low numbers due to fewer girls in these classes and fewer participants so they will have a coop with Albany. He also mentioned an evacuation drill will be held on October 28^a. He reported that it's been nice to have Chief Conway here on a daily basis. He congratulated the volleyball team on being back to back Conference Champs and continuing to have another successful season. He stated the safety team has been very active. He reported staff has been broken up into groups for each month to encourage staff (treats, recognition and encouragement are among a few of the things the groups are focusing on). - II. Introduction of Board Members: Board President Randall Smith introduced himself and the following board members: Becky Clark, Vice President; Ron Blumer, Clerk; Tyler Smith, Treasurer; Members Mike Aquino, Sally Roe, and Elise Constantini. Also introduced were Allen Brokopp, District Administrator; Mark Gustafson, PreK-12 Principal; Christina Karlen, District Bookkeeper; Denise Swanson, District Administrative Assistant.
- III. Election of Chairperson to conduct meeting: May Burgy nominated Randall Smith as chairperson and moved that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Randall Smith; second by Richard Rufer, motion carried.
- New Business: Treasurer's Report: Tyler Smith reported General Fund (10) revenues of \$5,572,670 and IV. expenditures of \$5,383,930; Special Projects (21) revenue of \$132,706 and expenditures of \$106,974; Special Education Fund (27) revenues of \$673,830 and expenditures of \$673,830; Debt Service Fund (30) revenues of \$214,252 and expenditures of \$215,746; Capital Projects Fund (49) revenues of \$0 and expenditures of \$0; Food Service (50) revenues of \$335,740 and expenditures of \$281,551. Also reported were interfund revenue transfers of (\$398,718) and expenditure transfers of (\$398,718). Motion by Richard Rufer to approve, seconded by May Burgy and motion carried. Budget Hearing and presentation of the 2022-2023 Budget: Mr Brokopp thanked everyone for coming. He said it's been a busy year, but a normal kind of busy (part of that is due to the passing of the referendum). He thanked Christina Karlen for doing such a great job of getting the numbers out there for the referendum. He also thanked Denise Swanson for getting the pupil count numbers together. We are finishing the 2021-22 school year by adding our fund balance by \$189,000. A balanced Fund 10 budget for 2021-22 was presented by Mr Brokopp. The total budget representing all funds is \$6,922,198. This represents a 4.6% increase in expenditures over last year. The proposed property tax levy is anticipated at \$2,566,931. We estimate our Mill Rate will be 8.6%. Mr. Brokopp then shared he learned at a concert that households have decreased, why rural America is starting to decline and that it is also why our numbers have decreased. We were blessed by the support of community with the passing of the referendum for operating expenses. Managing school finance during a pandemic was a challenge but beneficial to both our regular budget and our food service budget. We continue to invest in our mental health team especially because the pandemic has brought on new anxieties and challenges. We continue to invest in our students' futures. We continue to be leaders in our area in technology by providing fee free 1:1 devices for all students. Shared classes continue to be very impactful and are going quite well. Our Annual Day of Service started in the spring of 2016 and was back for 2022. Hearing on the Budget: None. Approval to levy a school tax of \$2,566,931 for the 2022-2023 school year: Motion by Richard Rufer to approve a tax levy on all taxable property of the district for operating expenses and capital outlay and debt retirement for the 2022-23 school year in the amount of \$2,566,931, seconded by Lita Appel, motion carried. Approval of salaries for the Board of Education for 2022-2023: Motion was made to approve school board member salaries by May Burgy, seconded by Richard Rufer as follows: President, \$1225.00; Clerk, \$975.00; Treasurer, \$975.00; and Member, \$925.00. Motion carried. **Approval of payment of actual and necessary** expenses of board members who travel in the performance of their duties: Motion made to approve those School Board members be compensated for actual and necessary expenses when traveling in the performance of their duties by May Burgy, seconded by Richard Rufer, motion carried. Approval to sell or dispose of school property: Motion to authorize the school board to sell or dispose of obsolete or unused furniture and equipment which is no longer needed by the district by Richard Rufer, seconded by Lita Appel, motion carried. Approval to lease school property: Motion to authorize lease of school property to any person for a term not to exceed fifteen years made by Richard Rufer, seconded by May Burgy, motion carried. Authorization to acquire real estate through purchase or condemnation: Motion to authorize acquisition of real estate through purchase or condemnation by Richard Rufer, seconded by May Burgy, motion carried.

- IV. (cont'd) Authorization to short term borrow: Motion by Richard Rufer to authorize short term borrowing, seconded by May Burgy, motion carried. Vote a tax to purchase vehicles: Motion by Lita Appel to authorize to vote a tax to purchase vehicles, seconded by May Burgy, motion carried.
