ANNUAL MESSAGE TO THE COMMUNITY

Dear Community Members:

The last two years have been full of unprecedented challenges. Through the stress and turmoil, I am even more proud of the state of our district. Proud because our families and community continue to be amazing partners and so supportive. Proud because our staff has handled everything their profession has thrown at them with grace and passion. We appreciate everyone's willingness to allow us to be progressive in our mission to provide many opportunities to implement a vision of success for Monticello youth.

We are finishing the 2021-2022 school year by adding \$189,000 to our fund balance. We are currently presenting a balanced Fund 10 budget for 2022-2023. Our total budget representing all funds is \$6,922,198. This represents a 4.6% increase in expenditures over last year. Our proposed property tax levy is anticipated at \$2,566,931. With the information available to us, we estimate that our mill rate will be 8.6%. This is a slight increase of .1% over last year even after passing the August referendum.

Our budget and policies will allow us to prioritize the following essential areas vital to student success:

- In August we were again blessed by the support of our community with the passing of another successful referendum for operating expenses. Much of this referendum is for general operations like staffing, utilities, and general supplies and maintenance. Part of those expenses are maintaining our building on a larger scale. We are remodeling our STEM/Tech Ed area and building a bus garage. We are also upgrading a section of our elementary and adding classroom furniture to various areas. Finally, we will use the referendum money to renew some of our transportation fleet and maintenance equipment.
- Managing school finance during a pandemic was a challenge but beneficial to both our regular budget and our food service budget. Grant revenues due to state and federal relief grants (ESSER) have allowed us to be creative in staffing and with programming. The down side is the uncertainty of funding once the grant money is finishing in 2024.
- We continue to invest in our mental health team by employing a full time school counselor, a part-time school psychologist, a part-time licensed mental health counselor, a part-time elementary school counselor and director of pupil services. Ever since the pandemic, our diverse team has masterfully handled the new anxieties and challenges that have emerged for our staff and students.
- We continue to invest in our students' futures. Our school board continues to provide scholarship opportunities to reward students taking dual enrollment classes and who earn A's by reimbursing half of their tuition. This has saved thousands of dollars for Monticello families.

- We continue to be leaders in consciously driving technology forward. Since 2018, we have provided fee free 1:1 devices (Chromebooks) for our 3-12 students and now we are able to be completely 1:1 for all students. In addition, we have also completed 100% of our next generation interactive white board project.
- We continue to collaborate with the Albany, Brodhead, Blackhawk, and Juda School Districts as we increase our capacity to share classes via telepresence and connect with other school districts and institutions of higher learning. Our dual credit options have steadily grown. Thanks to our technology, creative scheduling, and some dedicated teachers who put extra time into their own education, we are now offering 10 different dual enrollment or Advanced Placement classes. These classes include College English 101 & 201, College Literature, Astronomy, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Physics, Spanish IV, AP US History, and AP Chemistry. Classes like Medical Terminology, Oral and Written Communication, Shop Math, Psychology, Accounting, Sociology, College Mathematics, Animal Science, and three Welding classes also serve as dual credits with area tech schools. In addition, JAM'B's (Juda, Albany, Monticello, Brodhead, Blackhawk) academic cooperative has allowed us to offer Tech Math, Computer Programming, and Video Gaming via Telepresence. Over the past 7 years our enrollment in these classes has skyrocketed. Our academic cooperative has helped us capture significant grant funding to improve collaborative technology and pave the way for more partnerships. Thanks to these partnerships, we continue to have students graduating from Monticello with significant amounts of secondary education credits. Ultimately, it's giving Monticello's students a head start at their next level of education and saving money for our families.
- Our Annual Day of Service started in the spring of 2016 and was back for 2022. It's been a great way to give back to our community and have our students interact and be active members of Monticello. We include 4K-12 students in various projects. This year's service day will be April 21st. Please let us know if you have any projects with which you need assistance.

We are very proud of the education and future that a Monticello diploma offers our students. We are committed to continuous academic and socio-emotional growth and to providing opportunities only a small rural school can offer. Thank you for your continued support of our school and keep in mind our mission statement, Monticello's Values Grow World Ready Citizens!

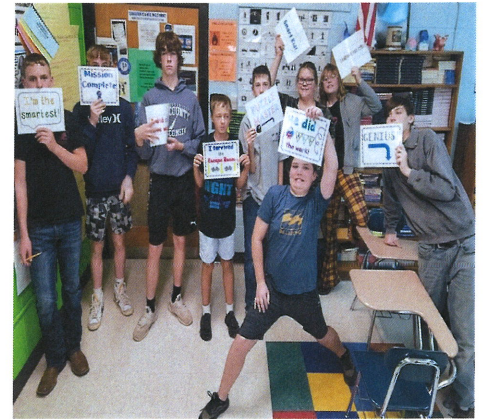

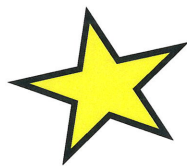

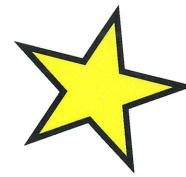

SPANISH CLUB NEWS

Tait Swanson, Jenna Sherman, and Natalie Wahl traveled to Buenos Aires last summer and spent an entire month immersing themselves in the Spanish language (with the beautiful sounding Argentine accent) and Argentine culture firsthand through the CIEE (Consejo de Intercambio Educativo Internacional) program. These kids all received significant scholarships from a very generous donor, so they ended up paying a very small price to live and study abroad in high school for one month. In the future, the goal is to have a few to a handful of Spanish students do the CIEE program every two years. So once you learn more about their experience, next year we will be promoting this program and their Spanish study abroad in high school programs again. These three students shared their memories with Spanish Club during our last meeting to make others aware of the possibilities for them (see photos).

They all agreed that the highlight of their trip was seeing Iguazu Falls, which ended up being a complete surprise flight to see the most magnificent waterfalls in the world! However, the day-to-day life did not disappoint. Each day consisted of a few hours of class in the morning, lunching at a cafe with classmates, and then going out into the streets and putting their skills to use with some sort of practical activity like ordering in a restaurant or asking for directions, and then heading home for supper with the host family. Every morning for breakfast at their homestays, the kids got to try the delicious dulce de leche on toast or cookies for breakfast, along with café con leche or mate (an infusion of South American herbs, similar to a tea that is full of antioxidants and healing properties) brewed in all different flavors and fashions. They saw the famous female Mexican artist, Frida Kahlo's works of art on display at the Museum of Latin American Art of Buenos Aires. They explored the city's lively neighborhoods loaded with cafes, trendy shops, and European-influenced architecture. They got to go to a rancho and learn about the cowboy way of life and taste the best beef in the world! This life changing experience has broadened their minds and also given them the travel bug. All three students are headed to Costa Rica with other Spanish Club members in June of 2023. We can't wait for a tropical destination right after school is out! Costa Rica, like Argentina, will be a blast!

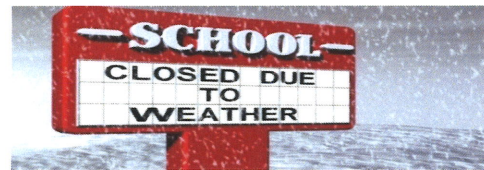

School Nurse Notes

- **Teeth!** Hopefully there are some happier teeth in Monticello! October is our annual dental hygiene month in the elementary classrooms. Elementary students were taught the importance of brushing two times a day for about 2 minutes each time and flossing once per day in order to have healthy teeth and bright shining smiles. Some fun experiments were done to show us how harmful sugar is to our teeth. And speaking of teeth, we have had our first visit from our in-school dental provider, Bridging Brighter Smiles, who provides preventative dental care including oral screenings, cleaning, fluoride applications, and sealants to students right at school. Students need to be enrolled in order to participate. Bridging Brighter Smiles accepts two forms of payment: Forward Health (Badgercare) Card or a standard fee. Those students covered by Forward Health will see no bill or co-payment. Families opting to pay out of pocket will note that fees are very reasonable. Bridging Brighter Smiles will be returning to school soon, and this is a great way to take care of those needed teeth cleanings. If interested in enrolling your student, please contact me at school for more details.
- **Play with the Ponies!** Is back for another year, and will be held on November 10th from 6-7:30pm. Please find the permission slip in the newsletter to sign up your elementary student to join the fun! Fall Play with the Ponies features the sports of volleyball, football, and basketball.
- **Immunizations!** Every fall I complete our school's required state immunization report and audit checking on our students compliance with required State of Wisconsin school immunizations. Thank you to parents for making sure your child(ren) are up-to-date on all needed immunizations! And it is not too late to schedule a flu shot and COVID booster. An ounce of prevention.....

A friendly reminder to everyone that it is important that students wear proper clothing while riding the bus so they stay warm this winter. At a minimum, students need a coat and protection for their head, hands and feet. If a bus should have mechanical issues and be detained along the roadside for any period of time, the temperature in the bus can drop fast! High School students need to be reminded also that it is important to have warm clothing in their vehicles as well.

Also, please make sure students waiting for the bus stand back until all vehicles have come to a complete stop. On the slippery roads, buses and other vehicles cannot stop like they can on dry pavement and we do not want anyone getting hurt.

It is crucial for you to be calling in your student's attendance when they will be absent. If you are calling to let us know your child will not be riding the bus in the morning and/or after school, please call the attendance line at 938.4194, option 1.

If there are late start days, snow days, or early release days, please make sure you have other arrangements in place for your student(s).

The decision to operate or close school is based on weather conditions and local road reports. Closing information will be broadcast over local radio and television stations. Watch and listen between the hours of 6:00 and 7:00 a.m.

When school has to be closed during the school day, it will be broadcast *as soon as the decision is made*. Whenever possible, students will be served lunch with buses leaving right after. In the event of a 2 hour delay, Early Childhood would be cancelled. If the decision is made to release school after lunch, afternoon classes for Early Childhood would not be held. **Parents are reminded to have a plan in place so your children know what to do if school is dismissed early.** We will also notify families via emails and, if possible, texts.

- II. **Approve Agenda:** Motion by Becky Clark, seconded by Ron Blumer to approve the agenda, motion carried.
- III. A discussion was had about the consideration of referendum projects borrowing.
- IV. Motion by Tyler Smith to adjourn at 8:17 p.m., seconded by Sally Roe, motion carried.

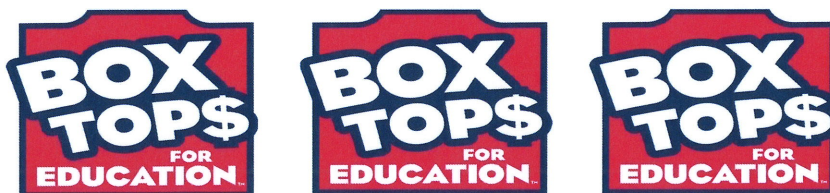
SCHOOL DISTRICT OF MONTICELLO

September 14, 2022

- I. **Call to Order:** Meeting called to order by Randall Smith at 7:30 p.m. Present: Tyler Smith, Mike Aquino, Sally Roe, and Elise Constantini. Absent: Ron Blumer and Becky Clark. Administration: Al Brokopp, Mark Gustafson, Carley Francois, and Denise Swanson. Faculty: Alma Mentz, Deb Freitag, Mackenzie Sarbacker, Chris Pickett, Dawson Babcock and Sarah Quade. Audience: Lita Appel.
- II. **Pledge of Allegiance:** The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.
- III. **Approve Agenda:** Motion by Tyler Smith to approve the agenda and to approve the addition of a WIAA Coop discussion to the agenda, seconded by Mike Aquino, motion carried.
- IV. **Communications/Concerns from the Public:** Lita Appel addressed the board about a safety protocol. Certification of Participation in WASB was passed around. Thank you to MPPM Insurance for their annual monetary donation of school supplies. Thank you to Jacob's SWAG for the mental health floor stickers. Thank you to Lt. Harkey for serving custard at our Open House on August 25th.
- V. **Faculty Report:** Ms. Mentz informed the board about how all day 4K is going. Though tiring, they are accomplishing a lot due to a full time aide and 2 teachers and getting a lot of individual work time. There's a great guidance program they're using that helps the students understand their feelings. Mrs. Freitag said all is going well in middle school. She also said Ms. Sarbacker and Mr. Pickett are great additions to the middle school. **Treasurer's Report:** Tyler Smith reported total cash receipts of \$700,241.48 and total expenses of \$402,206.62 for August. **Food Service Report:** None.
- VI. **Administrative Team Reports:** Mr. Gustafson introduced our new staff members and a few who have switched positions – Dawson Babcock, MS/HS Band Director; Chris Pickett, MS Math Teacher; Mackenzie Sarbacker – MS Special Education; Carley Francois – Director of Pupil Services. Mr. Gustafson also stated school started off well. Mr. Brokopp reported UW Oshkosh is up and going for our College English courses. Mr. Brokopp also updated the board on an annual committee policy meeting about human growth and development and wellness.

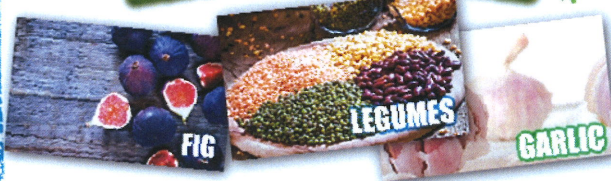
