### **FUN TIMES IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**



Hope everyone's school year is off to a terrific start! It feels like it has been a fast and furious start! Couple of things...

**GIVING HAND WASHING A HIGH FIVE!** We are drowning germs by remembering to wash our hands with soap and water for 20 seconds, especially before eating and after using the bathroom. Elementary students did some fun activities and experiments learning all about germs and how hand washing helps keep us well! And ask them to show how we wash our hands in Monticello! And encourage it at home, too.

**Immunizations!** The Green County Health Department will be coming to school on **October 6th offering flu and COVID-19 booster vaccination to our students.** Please watch for more information coming soon on how to sign up. The COVID booster can be administered two months after the last COVID-19 vaccine and is now recommended for anyone 12 years and older to boost immunity against Omicron variant BA4 and BA5 specifically. According to the CDC, getting an annual flu vaccine is the first and best way to protect yourself and your family from the flu. Flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations. The CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine\_for everyone 6 months and older. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for protection to set in so start thinking about getting vaccinated now.

**SICK?** We are working hard to keep ourselves healthy, but an occasional illness in kids that keeps them home from school is inevitable. Below are some reminders for when to keep your child home from school....

Where many kids gather, there will be germs~ COVID and otherwise! There are some times when it is in the best interest of your child (and our whole school) to take a day off to rest and recover. Here are some reminders of when your child should not attend school due to illness:

- Fever >100: Fevers indicate a child is fighting off some sort of illness. Your child should be fever-free for 24 hours (without any fever reducing medications like acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Advil) before returning to school.
- **Vomiting or diarrhea**: Please keep your child home until he/she is able to keep down food from at least the evening before and breakfast that morning and no further diarrhea.
- Bacterial illnesses like strep throat, pink eye, and impetigo: Students can return to school after being on antibiotics for 24 hours.

When deciding if your child can go to school, use your best judgment and keep in mind that if your child is uncomfortable, he/she won't be able to concentrate or learn. You may also want to call your child's medical provider or nurse triage line for further help deciding. Please remember to call the Pony Attendance line 938-4194 to report when your child will be absent due to illness/injury.

- XIII. Adjourn: Motion by Sally Roe to adjourn at 8:43 p.m., seconded by Tyler Smith. Motion carried.





### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED PRICE SCHOOL MEALS FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2022-23

### Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Monticello School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.85; lunch costs \$2.85 for elementary, \$3.15 for MS/HS Classic and \$3.60 for MS/HS Premium. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch. This packet includes an application for free or reduced price meal benefits, and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

- 1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?
