

School Board Powers and Duties

The Monticello Board of Education has three major functions: policymaking, budgeting, and evaluation.

The policy making function is the formation of policies to guide the decisions of the Board. Policies will be reviewed annually. The details of administrative rules and regulations within the framework of the policies are subjective to the approval of the Board, but are left to the school administrator to convert into operation.

The budgeting function consists primarily of approving the means by which the Board policies can be put into effect. This approval should be based on the recommendation of the administrator who is guided by the policies the Board has established.

The evaluation function is necessary to point out the strong and weak points in the school system and to establish a basis for necessary change. After evaluating all the facts pertaining to any given situation, the Board is empowered to take action on the results of the evaluations.

The Board shall represent and act for the state in providing the district with the kind of educational programs and facilities required or permitted by law and shall further perform the specific duties imposed upon the Board by the statutes.
